

Recalls

Enables lenders to automatically notify borrowers of recalls and track assets lent using EquiLend or any other trading method



The EquiLend Recalls service allows lenders to issue a recall to borrowers for US and non-US securities. Criteria-based recalls allow a client to recall across any open loan. When used with Contract Comparison, lenders can recall specific US and non-US contracts using a unique EquiLend ID. This reduces the chance of a lender recalling an incorrect contract.

Using the EquiLend platform's direct link to the DTCC ARMS hub, any EquiLend client can recall US securities from non-EquiLend counterparties with whom they have transacted (US only). The entire process is automated, making recall management simple.

How Recalls Works

A lender initiates a recall for a specific contract using a unique EquiLend ID, or issues a more general recall for one or more securities

The borrower can optionally acknowledge receipt of a recall through an easy-to-use monitor or through messages integrated into their proprietary recall system

EquiLend provides reports and tracking capabilities to monitor recall status online

Key Features

- Ability to recall US equities non-US equities and fixed income securities
- Automated process making recall management simple, eliminating the need for faxes and emails
- When used with either AutoBorrow or Contract Comparison, a unique ID enables recall of a specific security lot
- Update recall status via XLS file upload
- Agree bilaterally to automate recalls with each legal entity
- Customization and filters allow users to personalize screen with relevant fields

- Borrowers can set their systems to automatically acknowledge the recall or have active control
- Ability to bilaterally agree on customized cut off times by market
- Initiate recalls via the browser, XLS file uploads, or messaging
- Through a direct link to the DTCC ARMS hub, EquiLend clients can recall US securities from non-EquiLend clients with whom they have transacted (US only)
